

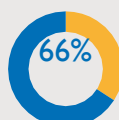
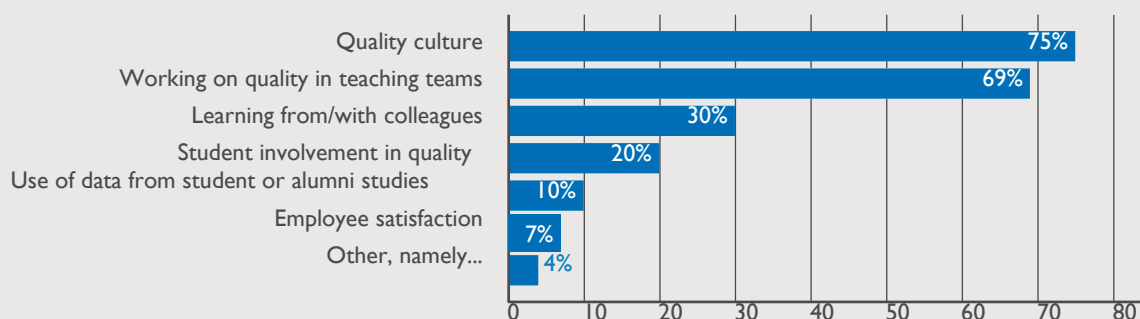
# Work impact inventory

## National Coordination Point for EQAVET, 2018

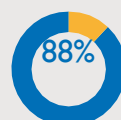
The National Coordination Point (NCP) for EQAVET works to enhance quality assurance in vocational education and training (MBO) in the Netherlands.<sup>1</sup> Topics include: enhancing the quality culture and establishing a link between quality assurance at institutional and team level. ### QUALITY CULTURE IS THE THEME WHICH MOST PEOPLE ASSOCIATE WITH THE NCP

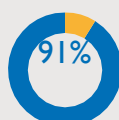
Awareness of the themes which the NCP EQAVET focuses on:



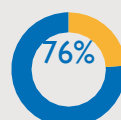
66% of the respondents have attended a meeting of the NCP.



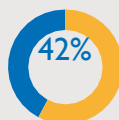
88% of the respondents stated that EQAVET's work should be known to more people within their own organisation.



91% of this group stated that they found the meetings to be useful.



76% of the respondents stated that the quality culture could be enhanced still further.



42% of the respondents use the guides which have been developed by the NCP and which can be found on the website.

- The vast majority of the respondents indicated that the quality culture has recently been enhanced.
- Most of the respondents wish to stay in contact with the NCP EQAVET via the newsletter.
- Many also wish to attend NCP EQAVET meetings in the future.

### CONCLUSIONS AND RECOMMENDATIONS

- Quality culture is the main theme for the NCP.
- Meetings, guides and the NCP newsletter are appreciated.
- The usability of the website could be improved. A new website is under development and will be launched next year.
- In 2019, the NCP will examine ways to reach more managers and trainers with its work. In meetings, it will also focus more strongly on translating the insights into the organisation.
